

Prepare to Apply

The Marketplace offers different types of health plans to meet a variety of needs and budgets. You will need to figure out how much you can and want to spend each month on health coverage.

Most people using the Marketplace will qualify for tax credits or cost sharing to save money. To find out what health coverage you are eligible for when you apply it will help to have the following information on hand for yourself and every member of your household that needs coverage:

- Social Security number or document ID number (Green Card for example) – for each person.
- Full name and birthdate.
- Pay-stubs, W-2 forms or “Wage and Tax Statement” from your employer.
- Information about how much insurance would cost if it is offered through your work (even if you can’t afford it).
- Your email address and password.
- Login information if you already have an account on the Marketplace.

Incomes that May Qualify

for Lower Costs

If your income is below the following, you may qualify for Iowa Health and Wellness coverage.

Even if your income is as high as the following, you will likely qualify for lower premiums and possibly savings on out-of-pocket costs like deductibles and copayments.

A main goal of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) is to help qualified, uninsured people find quality, affordable healthcare. The Health Insurance Marketplace is an important part of this goal. Through the Marketplace, eligible people will be able to enroll in a free or more affordable health plan to get coverage.

You only need to fill out one online application in the Marketplace to compare all your options, to learn if you qualify for Medicaid or Hawk-I, and to be able to choose from the plans available in your area. You can also find out if you qualify for lower costs on monthly premiums or may get free or very low cost coverage. You will be able to get information about covered services and prices before you decide.

All health plans offered on the Marketplace must cover a minimum set of benefits such as preventative care, doctor visits, hospital stays, mental health and substance abuse services, and care during pregnancy. **Plans must treat everyone fairly and may not deny anyone due to a pre-existing condition.**
